**Receiving Treasurer's Report:** Randy moved and Chris seconded to receive the Treasurer's Report. Unanimously approved.

**Accepting Minutes from Last Meeting:** Fred moved and Clarke seconded accepting the minutes from the October meeting. Unanimously approved.

### **Old Business:**

- Capital Campaign Progress: the stained glass windows are all in and paid for.
  - Solar Project discussion: Reed reported that we have received a report on the nave roof structure and its suitability for supporting solar panels. The report recommended some work to be done if we wished to put solar panels on the roof. If we do the reinforcing, we'd also then probably also put on a new roof before putting solar panels on. We could put the solar panels only on the sheep run and the parish house, which should satisfy the church's needs. We could instead put money away each year for a few years to build up a fund to do the repairs, put on a new roof, and then do the solar. We'll hope for more information and make the decision next month.

- Capital Campaign Outreach—continued discussion. We have committed to put 10% of our capital campaign income into charitable gifts. We discussed having three committees, one for local charity, one for diocesan needs, and one for global needs.
   Steve and Fred both agreed to be on a committee to begin to come up with a plan that they'll present at the December meeting.
- Diocesan Convention: Reed reported on the meeting. The business meeting was held on Zoom on Friday evening, which made things more accessible for everyone. The worship service was at Trinity church in Claremont. All resolutions passed unanimously, and it was a successful Convention.
- Staff Salaries/Bonuses: Jim and Reed presented a sheet with recommendations, and we
  discussed some options. Jim would like our budget decisions made at the 19 December
  meeting.
- 2024 Budget Preview: Jim presented a few of his estimates for next year's budget. He hopes to have the budget set and ready to vote on for our 19 December meeting.

### **New Business:**

- EM Licensing Approval: Randy moved and Clarke seconded to have George Swenson approved a Eucharistic Minister. Unanimously approved.
- "Beyond Inviting and Welcoming," from Rev. Stephanie Speller's book Radical Hospitality: We discussed some of the issues the book raises and how we see them happening at St. Andrew's. Reed posed some questions for next steps, such as How do we "operationalize" our insight? How do we talk with newcomers? What do we say? Do we "script" those words? How do you know when you're a member here?
- 2023-2024 Accessibility Grant: the Dioceses has an accessibility grant, and Jim thinks maybe we should see if we should apply for one. Susan moved and Fred seconded to empower Jim and Clarke to fill out the application and apply for this grant. Unanimously approved.
- Assistant Treasurer 12-17 December 2023: Liz offered to fill this position while Jim is gone.
- Fred gave a brief report on nominations.

### Advent

- We are preparing a Jesse Tree project for all who desire to make one and take it home (especially well suited for young folks)
- With a larger Jesse Tree in the nave to connect home and Sunday worship, and bring all into the Jesse Tree experience
- Committee Focus for the next year+
  - The Committee plans to shift from our prior focus on seasonal one-off style offerings (one day or multi-week) aimed primarily at adults, and to instead work on a model that builds outward intentionally from the firm center we already have, theologically and in practice, in the Atrium. This can include care for the spiritual journeys of all ages.
  - Special focus will be given to
    - Youth Ministry. Beginning with one-off offerings that seek to build a group identity among our teens. Hoping to build to a more regular gathering practice. Possibly in partnership with other local churches.
    - Biblical Literacy/Engagement. Could include traditional "Bible Study", certainly, but also book groups, ideas for adapted ministry-group practices, worship, and more.

# OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORTS VESTRY MEETING NOVEMBER 28, 2023

### **BLOOD DRIVE**—George Schell & Jim Whinn

At the October 18<sup>th</sup> St. Andrew's blood drive, the American Red Cross collected 26 units of whole blood.

There were 10 volunteers, 8 from St. Andrew's and 2 from First Congregational Church, who helped at this drive. The next American Red Cross blood drive at St. Andrew's is scheduled for December 20, 2023.

### **GOT LUNCH**—Judy McPhail

We have two new families bringing the total to ten families totaling 22 children.

We received a \$1,500 donation in August and have used some of that money to provide each classroom teacher (16) at Harold Martin School with a \$30 gift card at Market Basket to pay for the snacks the teachers traditionally provide for hungry students. GOT LUNCH will be providing the same at Maple Street School in the future.

One parishioner paid the outstanding hot lunch bill for five families for the first two months of the school year. The total was \$300. and had been researched and verified by the director of the of food services. These families do not qualify for reduced or free lunch as they earn only a few hundred dollars over the limit.

### FRIENDLY KITCHEN—Debbie Monroe

All is well with The Friendly Kitchen. We have three new cooks/servers, Randy Galinat, Martha Buttenheim and Jacqui Davis, who are working with Pam and Ed till they feel confident on their own. The number of guests varies from the 50's to the 70's each night. We like to have at least 4 servers plus the cook and dish washer. We can always use more volunteers.

FAMILY PROMISE—Chris Miller

The scheduled Family Promise week in September was canceled because there were no families ready to move in. Family Promise Main Office has been in turmoil since their case manager left. There are now two families who should start with us the week of December 3<sup>rd</sup>. A new case manager was due to start 11/13/23. The board, which now includes our parishioner Issac Davis, is looking for a house to buy where the families would not have to move weekly and the churches would come in to help on a rotating basis. This is now the model in Exeter and Nashua. They need to find a house and a down payment.

### THANKSGIVING DONATIONS

I asked if anyone was interested in coordinating this ministry and no one seemed to be since Dimitri's is no longer cooking turkeys.

Randy Galinat has agreed to pick a 2024 date and organize this event.

### **FOOD PANTRY**—Paul Carey

I've nothing new to report. Food pantry donations remain infrequent.

### **LOOSE PLATE**—Kim Wertz

July/August - Old Dogs Go to Helen - \$335.50 sent (delivered by Peter Daley)

September/October - Episcopal Relief and Development designated for the Hawaii fire disaster - \$594.91 collected. This will be sent by December 1<sup>st</sup>. It was held until there was a matching gift available.

1st Sunday Loose Plate always goes 100% to Rector Discretionary Fund. In November, the plate collection was \$759.60 which has already been sent to American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem.

### **PETER DALEY'S COLLECTIONS**—Peter Daley

Starting in the fall of 2022 St. Andrews church started collecting warm winter coats for children and adults for our homeless population. It was estimated that over 50 coats were collected. Along with coats, the collection of gloves, hats, hand warmers, sweatpants, sweatshirts ,socks and belts was added.

In the Spring of 2023 the community was asked to collect personal hygiene products on a weekly basis for the population that is provided for by Family Promise and the Friends Emergency Shelter. Along with personal care items, it was asked to collect diapers for the young population. An average of 3 bags per week containing these items is collected.
